STUDENT CONGRESS

Running alongside the Professional Congress Programme, the Student Congress is an integral part of the event. Conceptualised and run by a committee of graduate, masters and current architectural students from the University of KwaZulu-Natal (UKZN) and Durban University of Technology (DUT), the student contribution to the event is significant. Student Committee President Sinethemba Buthelezi is assisted by two Programme Co-ordinators and 22 Event Co-ordinators.

THE STUDENT PROGRAMME

The UIA2014 Durban Student Programme has been designed to articulate the opinions, ideas and aspirations of students, from around the world. Over the four days of the Congress, SIX events will run parallel to those of the professional programme:

- The Schools Outreach Project will allow visiting and local professionals and students to participate in engaging with learners around design and career opportunities in the built environment.
- The UIA 2014 Pecha Kucha - a dynamic and exciting gathering to share work, ideas, and thoughts around the congress themes.
- Archiball, a long-standing Durban tradition now placed on an international stage.
- The Student Debate will conclude with the drawing up of the UIA2014 Student Charter on Architectural Education, as well as the presentation of the Murray & Roberts Des Baker Student Competition Award.
- Student Closing Party - the highlight of the week's proceedings, experienced in an 'Otherwhere' venue.
- An Online film competition in collaboration with The Architect Africa Film Festival 2014


TOP LEVEL SPEAKERS

We are thrilled to welcome an illustrious line-up of top-level international keynote Speakers. Don't miss the opportunity to hear them first hand, on South African soil!

New to the Speaker line-up are Toyo Ito & Wally Serote

Toyo Ito is a Japanese architect, whose work and awards pervade the realm of architecture. He graduated in 1969 and founded his studio, Urban Robot, in 1971 in Tokyo. Toyo is currently the Honorary Fellowship of both the AIA and the RIBA, whilst holding the title of Commissioner of Kumamoto Artpolis. Between 1986 and 2013, Toyo received 19 awards, the most recent being the prestigious Pritzker Architecture Prize in 2013. Toyo's work has contributed significantly to the educational front in Japan, as well as representing Japanese design on the international stage.



South African **Dr. Mongane Wally Serote** is currently the Chairman of the board of JOBURG THEATERS, a board member of the Thabo Mbeki Foundation, Associate Professor at UNISA, African Renaissance Foundation chairperson, Indigenous Knowledge System of SA and Freedom Park CEO (a national heritage project in Pretoria). Serote is a renowned, award-winning writer and poet and a graduate of Columbia University. He has worked in the Arts and Culture Department of the African National Congress (ANC).

TOYO ITO and **KAZUO IWAMURU** will present a Workshop called *Japan Forum: Beyond Disasters*. Following the UIA2011 Tokyo Declaration "Beyond Disasters, Through Solidarity, Towards Sustainability," JIA will organize a forum to present architects' initiatives taken after the devastating disaster of 3 November 2011 in the Eastern Region of Japan

DYNAMIC PARALLEL PROJECT

PROGRAMME FOR UIA2014

Besides the exciting Scientific Programme a dynamic and diverse Parallel Project Programme is being run to expand the scope of the Congress and further conversations around the themes and pertinent built environment issues. Showcasing local, national and international talent, and a range of City venues, these projects will be open to delegates and the general public.

Above/Below, Dessus-Dessous


A creative collaboration between the Wits School of the Arts, the School of Architecture and Planning and the French light artist Chia-Wen Tsai, this project will see a light-water-sound installation in a prominent Durban public swimming pool.

Retroactive

This public art intervention involves the painting of 100 circular concrete pavement storm water drain covers in the city centre. The content of the hand painted covers are graphic images of the indigenous/traditional dwellings of 13 of South Africa's 'ethnic' groups.

Durbanity

Five student and five professional photographers from the Durban Centre for Photography (DCP) embark on a five month long project to create a 'visual audit' of the city of Durban. This entails the photographic documentation of various aspects of the city and its peripheries, to better understand the dynamics of contemporary urbanization patterns and emerging urban cultures.
